1 I, ERIC NORDSKOG, declare as follows:

2 1. I am a Director of A.B. Data, Ltd.’s Class Action Administration Division (“A.B. Data”),
3 whose corporate office is located in Milwaukee, Wisconsin. I am fully familiar with the facts contained
4 herein based upon my personal knowledge.

5 2. I submit this declaration at the request of Class Counsel to provide the Court and the parties
6 to the above-captioned action with updated information regarding the distribution of the Net Settlement Fund¹
7 proceeds to the Class. I have personal knowledge of the facts set forth herein and, if called as a witness,
8 could and would testify competently thereto.

9 3. I previously submitted a declaration on November 30, 2023 informing the Court that A.B.
10 Data had mailed a total of 42,337 Notice Packets to potential Class Members, brokers, and other
11 nominees. A.B. Data has fully processed 11,741 Claims, representing an approximate 27.7% response
12 rate. A.B. Data had received 2,927 eligible claims totaling \$138,594,713.92 in total Recognized Loss
13 Amount. Moreover, A.B. Data has received no objections to the settlement and one request for exclusion
14 from the Class.

15 4. Attached hereto as Exhibit A is the current summary of the Post-Distribution Accounting
16 requested by the Court. The information shown in Exhibit A comes from records kept in the ordinary
17 course of business by A.B. Data, Class Counsel and the Escrow Agent, and is information typically
18 relied on by A.B. Data to perform notice and claims administration duties. The chart shown in Exhibit
19 A will also be posted on the Settlement Website – www.MaxarSecuritiesSettlement.com.

20 5. On December 11, 2023, the Court issued an Order Concerning Motions for: A) Final
21 Approval of Settlement; and B) Attorney Fees and Costs (the “Final Approval Order”). The Final
22 Approval Order authorized payment of \$12,775,000.00 for attorneys’ fees; \$600,000.00 for litigation
23 costs and expenses; and \$10,000 as a service award to the Class Representative.

24 6. On May 17, 2024, A.B. Data distributed payments totaling \$23,391,061.05 to 2,757 Class
25 Members. Payment amounts for the Authorized Claims range from \$10.03 to \$2,531,118.26, and the



1 average recovery per claimant was \$8,484.24. Class Members were provided with a 120-day period to
2 deposit their checks before they became void, setting the initial check void date for September 14, 2024.
3 The payments included A.B. Data's contact information in the event a Class Member had questions or
4 needed their check reissued due to a name change.

5 7. As of the date of this declaration, 2,428 payments totaling \$20,712,765.84 have been
6 cashed. This represents a cash rate of 88.55%. After all checks are void and reasonable efforts to
7 encourage Class Members to cash their payments have been exhausted, A.B. Data, in consultation with
8 Class Counsel, will assess whether enough money remains in the Net Settlement Fund for a secondary
9 distribution to Class Members that cashed their initial payment. If a secondary distribution is not
10 recommended, the remains in the Net Settlement Fund will be donated to the Legal Aid Society of Santa
11 Clara County pursuant to the Settlement Agreement. *See* Settlement Agreement, ¶ 7.8. Based on my
12 experience in similar matters, this proposed handling of residual funds is standard and customary in
13 common fund class action settlements like this one.

14 I declare under penalty of perjury that the foregoing is true and correct.
